Club Program Announcement by Art Kunst, W3WM

It is difficult to believe that another year has passed by so quickly. With that has come the realization that I have served voluntarily as the Club's program facilitator for 3 1/2 years. In the beginning I was certain that regular and quality programs for each Club meeting would increase the loyalty of our members and result in much improved attendance. In the pursuit of quality programs of probable interest to the largest number of our members, I have sought input from the membership to guide my selections. Our programs addressed mostly technical subjects as befits a technical club and some non-technical ones. These programs were presented often by speakers

who came a considerable distance at no cost to the Club, and by generous use of video cassettes and film audio visuals. Although the quality of our programs has been consistently high as compared to other area ham radio clubs, my predicted increase in attendance was only partially fulfilled. Average monthly meeting attendance was 14 in 1986, 14 in 1985, 12 in 1984, and an estimated 6 or 7 in 1983. The range was disturbing as it went from a minimum of 4 to a maximum of 31 attendees. Based on the membership list of 50 members, we average some 20 to 25% of our members in attendance.

To continue quality programs with interesting speakers we need greater loyalty from our membership in attending every monthly meeting. We need an attendance of 20 to 25 members at every meeting to continue a viable program.


